Dear Mr Luo

Since 2008, I have convened a small but extraordinary group of business leaders each year with my co-Chair of the International Business Advisory Council and CEO of WPP Sir Martin Sorrell. The Council's insights into the economic and business environment help shape and refresh my view of the priorities for the year ahead and London's future.

At the 2014 meeting, I asked the Council to advise me on one of the greatest challenges posed by our growing economy and population – the problem of success. London currently leads the world in many sectors, but it is in danger of being overtaken by competitors who are ahead of it in strengthening their infrastructure. Last year I launched my first ever long-term infrastructure plan, setting out the investment needed in homes, water, energy, schools, transport, digital connectivity and better quality of life over the next half century. This builds on my joint campaign with other UK cities to give city leaders more control over locally-raised taxes that would allow us to pay for this much-needed infrastructure. The Council's advice has helped me to argue through these campaigns for measures that will not only help to ensure London's success, but will also boost the wider UK economy.

There are big challenges ahead in the global economy, challenges that threaten many of the building blocks of London's status as a centre for global commerce.

I would like to invite you to join the Council's next meeting in London on 3 March 2015 to discuss what we need to do to ensure the success of London's economy continues. It will begin at 4pm with a working session exploring issues pertinent to London's competitiveness with dinner afterwards.
